Echinacea pallida, commonly known as pale purple coneflower, is a coarse, hairy perennial of prairies with thin, green leaves. It has large, daisy-like flowers with drooping, pale pinkish-purple petals and knob-like, coppery-orange center cones. It shows best and benefits from mixing with grasses. This drought tolerant, herbaceous perennial provides nectar for hummingbirds and butterflies, and the leaves provide food for the Ottoe-skipper larva. Attracts birds and bees. Native Americans have recognized the medicinal value of Echinacea for centuries. Today, the plants are widely used, in supplements and herbal teas, for their numerous health benefits.
